Schedule – Practical skills in sequence analysis, 2 HEC (PNS0191)

The course will be conducted remotely via Zoom. The course will consist of five scheduled group sessions with time for independent study in between. Course participants will attend Zoom lectures and perform their own analyses between sessions and then discuss their progress with the course leader and other course participants during the following session. If a student cannot attend the final session, an alternative date for presentation of results will be arranged with the course leader.
