#### **Outdoor Teaching in Everyday Landscapes – A Rolling Workshop**

- A workshop lunch is planned for October/November where we have invited the Coordinator for the Landscape Lab, Björn Wiström, to join our project group with the aim of covering all Alnarp Campus *special garden units* in our outdoor teaching exchange; The rehab garden, The Swedish National Gene Bank, The Assortment Gardens, The Landscape Lab and the Historic Campus park educational gardens.

- A walk-and-talk through Alnarp Campus park and the Perennial and Annual Assortment gardens, led by Anna-Karin Ekwall and Åsa Klintborg Ahlklo. Alnarp's park history and trial fields, historical concept in educational gardens and parks. Importance for the development of in-house teaching and outreach activities.

### **Other outcomes:**

As a first result of this CFI-project the first year Landscape architect students will have a full day workshop in October focused on The Alnarp Campus as an area for teaching and learning as part of the Introduction course "Meeting landscape" (Möte med landskap) planned and led by Åsa Klintborg Ahlklo and course leader Karl Lövrie.

We also hope to communicate our findings to those in charge of the Alnarp Campus development plan. We believe this CFI-Landscape project highlights the vast opportunities offered by a well kept Campus park and its specialized scientific and educational gardens: the Rehab, the Horticutural Gene Bank, the Assortment Gardens for perennials and annuals, the Landscape Lab as well as the historic Silvibotanical and model design gardens. Together they form a unique and richly equipped educational campus with a highly profiled for all kinds of professional and popular outreach.
