WORKSHOP #5

Pedagogical challenge: supporting creativity at a distance

Creative work consists of many stages and some sort of impression often initializes the process. Landscape experience is an integral part of developing a reflective and professional creativity within the landscape field.

Exposing students to an experience of the blue environment along the seashore has played a major part in the Nature Based Intervention course and transferring this even into the distanced, digital environment is a challenge.

The participants will experience the seashore through the different formats of images and film. Following this, we will gather our impressions in a brain storming session, structure and discuss the results. (Using the most appropriate program, Padlet, Mural or other..)

Finally, we will discuss our personal experiences of how well the method works and consider the feasibility of applying it during the extent of the distancing measures.

The ambition is for this to be a method-development workshop, following which the method can be applied into the participants own tuition.
