AgriFose2030 has now been up and running for one year! We are busy translating science into policy and practice all over the program in our collective effort to contribute to the fulfillment of Sustainable Development Goal 2. Within all the four themes, there are colleagues from Africa, Asia and Sweden working together validating and synthesising the current science on agriculture for food security. We expect some 10-20 scientific review papers, briefs and reports from AgriFoSe2030 during the coming 12 months. Most of this synthesis work is based on fruitful exchanges of researchers to and from Swedish institutions.

So far, AgriFose2030 has also successfully arranged courses and workshops – this time in Kenya – on how to synthesise science and communicate to stakeholders.
