

The Government Offices of Sweden, SIANI, Sida and SIPRI invite you to Sweden's second global Food Systems Dialogue ahead of the UN Food Systems Summit 2021.

In a series of three global dialogues, actors connected to the Swedish international development cooperation will convene during the spring to discuss different aspects of the transformation of food systems. The global dialogues will complement Sweden's national and regional dialogues and provide global perspectives to Sweden's preparations to the summit.

The food systems of today are affected by conflict, and environmental, health and economic shocks and stresses. Bold action is urgently needed to transform food systems to become sustainable and resilient and recover from adverse effects.

Sweden's second global Food Systems Dialogue, *Food Security, Conflict and Resilience*, will take place on 29 April, 09:00 – 12:15 CEST, and specifically focus on the link between conflict and food insecurity as well as the need for stronger resilience.

During the dialogue knowledgeable speakers will share their perspectives. This will be followed by a workshop in line with the official Food Systems Dialogue methodology where participants will have the opportunity to share their knowledge, thoughts and ideas for change in an open and welcoming space.
