Partnership with sister organizations : MoU with NGARA and LoA with FAO


Network of experts and national institutions: National Agencies for GGW; forestry administration, private and public, communities and nongovernmental organizations



Species producing gums and resins and their distribution in targeted countries











Main actors in the NTFP value chains in selected countries

Producers/collectors: 95% of products collected from the wild

Processors: Small scale and traditional;

Traders: Dominated by women for all type of products

Exporters : poorly represented, the big share of the trade is done at local and national level



All gender groups involved but Women dominated activities along the value chain

Some key messages

On-going studies, but huge research/technology perspectives

Important livelihood support but untapped potential

Overlooked economic importance and inappropriate value adding technologies leading to unsustainable management practices

Poor knowledge on the resource potential, reconstitution capacity implying overharvesting and degradation of the producing stands

A strong political will to support the NTFP value chains in all targeted countries

A strong indigenous knowledge system associated to their use and management that could guide the development of improved value adding technologies
