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Our organisation

Natuurmonumenten / Dutch Association of Nature Conservation (2022)

- Largest private conservation organisation in The Netherlands
- 112.583 hectares of which 74.431 hectares Natura 2000
- 3.100 historical buildings of which 702 monuments, and 100 heritage sites
- 751 staff members and 6.833 volunteers, including 9 board members and 82 representatives in 12 member committees
- Society of 921.832 members and 92.257 children in the OERRR youth programme
- Financial support by members, benefactors, governments and businesses



Why volunteers?

Natuurmonumenten finds it important to offer people, especially members, the opportunity to make an active contribution to the protection of nature (not only by donation or membership)

A network of volunteers ensures that goals of Natuurmonumenten and natural areas are well anchored in society.

Addition of knowledge and experience to our organization.




Whats in it for me?

Types of volunteers in the organisation

- Board members and representatives of the association
- Management: nature conservation, heritage conservation, maintenance of public facilities
- Meeting the public: visitor centres, coffee corner, mobile meeting point,
- Administration: support of central en local teams, photo-archive, library
- Excursions and youth activities
- Rangers for both hospitality and surveillance
- Advocacy





In practice


- Policy: strategy on voluntary work
- Recruitment: specified applications, job interview, 3 months work probation period, contract
- Personal guidance: training period, training on the job, education, superivision at location (!but not always member of staff present)
- Materials: recognisable as voluntary staff by working clothes or uniform
- Budget: impulse budet and regular budget (expenses, presents, coordinating staff, presents, trips)
- Time: personal contact, information, survey



Visitor management

- > 17 million unique visitors, 50 million visits per year
- Focus on basic activities walking, cycling, boating and playing
- 10 visitor centres
 - 40 staff members ~ 5% of employees
- Many smaller centres or mobile meeting points
- 28,8% of 6.833 volunteers work in visitor reception ~ 18.728 days per year
