PROJECT SUMMARY

- NAP studies how city planning can advance sustainable urban lifestyles. Focus is on two governance strategies, namely nudging and participatory processes. While participation is based on citizen engagement, nudging is directly targeting behavior. The strategies are conventionally seen as incompatible.
- NAP investigates the (in)compatibility of nudging and participation, the role of power and ethics in the two strategies, and their change potential for sustainable urban
