Project: "Communicating One Health to children".

The project New communication models to prevent the spread of zoonotic bacteria and antibiotic resistance in activities where children and youth meet and handle animals from 2016-2018 will deliver a final report.

In this project which have been managed from The National Veterinary Institute in Sweden both Uppsala university and One Heath Sweden have been active partners.

The project has been presented at the Swedish Agricultural university conferences for naturbruksteachers, at 4H's training days and staff days as well as in Canada at the One Health EcoHealth conference in June.

Grants:

The two Uppsala university representatives in One Health Sweden's steering group, professor, MD Björn Olsen and Assoc. professor, MD Josef Järhult, have been awarded grants from the Swedish Research Council VR; Section Medicine and Health. Josef Järhult for his project Antimicrobial resistance in the environment and Human health impact, with a total of 6 million SEK during four years. Björn Olsen for his project Molecular mechanisms for the spread of Influenza A-virus between species, a total grant of 7,2 million SEK for a four year period.
