

How to cite data from the Swedish National Forest Inventory

Thank you for your interest in data from the Swedish NFI! Below is a summary of how you can cite the data in published material.

What is required if the data is published in a scientific journal or report?

We would like to know more about how data from the Swedish NFI is used. Therefore, "Swedish NFI" should be included in either the abstract or the keywords in articles where data from the Swedish NFI is used so that it is searchable.

How should I cite data I've received from the Swedish NFI?

In the main text use the following:
(Source: Swedish NFI, *year*)

In the bibliography use the follow reference:

Swedish National Forest Inventory, *year*. Unpublished data. The Department of Forest Resource Management. Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences, Umeå. <http://www.slu.se/nfi>

How should I cite statistics or information from the Swedish NFI's website?

In the main text use the following:
(Swedish NFI, *year*)

In the bibliography use the follow reference:

Swedish National Forest Inventory, *year*. *Forest Statistics*. <http://www.slu.se/foreststatistics> (from *yyyy-mm-dd*).

How should I cite statistics from the Swedish NFI's publication Skogsdata?

In the main text use the following:
(Skogsdata, *year*)

In the bibliography use the follow reference: Skogsdata, *year*. Dept. of Forest Resource Management, Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences, Umeå.



Is there a general reference that describes the Swedish NFI?

The following reference gives a good general description of the Swedish NFI:
