

Web content accessibility of Swedish LifeWatch

Here we describe the shortcomings in web accessibility for the Swedish LifeWatch websites and digital services at SLU Swedish Species Information Centre and the planning to remedy them. Here you will also find information about how you can contact the Swedish Species Information Centre should you encounter difficulties in website access.

The Swedish Species Information Centre strives to ensure that the website can be perceived, used, and understood by all users, regardless of disabilities or the tools employed. We aim to achieve at least the basic accessibility level by following [Web Content Accessibility Guidelines \(WCAG\) 2.1 at level AA](#).

Shortcomings

We are currently aware that we have not succeeded in fulfilling all the criteria of Web Content accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1 at level AA. For example:

- Documents in PDF format, such as manuals, exercises and technical descriptions.
- The websites <https://www.slu.se/en/subweb/swedish-lifewatch/> and <https://www.analysisportal.se/> does not have a responsive design for easy use on media such as smart phones or tablets.
- Videos on the sites may not be subtitled.
